Notes from a Wayside

"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

Matthew 11:28 (RSV)

It is a hazy Saturday afternoon. Today, I am at the southbound I-43 wayside in Alpine Valley. Many have come here to rest for a moment on their journeys. One family has stopped for a picnic lunch. One gentleman stopped to look for directions to an address in Walworth. He thanked me for assisting him. As we travel life's freeway, we are all busy moving from here to there, from point "A" to point "B" – and beyond. We can stop at a wayside to refresh our weary souls, nourish our hungry bodies, refocus our minds and get away – for a moment – from life in the fast lane.

As I relaxed, enjoying God's creation...and some little critters...I hearkened back to another journey, on a hazy morning, in a place far, far away. It was mid-July, 1989. I was one of four chaperones, and 16 youth, on a church workcamp trip. Our destination was Orland, Maine. The day before, we had stayed in a church in New Rochelle - after a tour of New York City. Today, we would journey on I-95 toward Boston. Entering Rhode Island, our nation's smallest state, not much larger than Walworth and Waukesha counties combined, we traveled toward and through Providence, and then into Massachusetts. The total crossing of Rhode Island, "pedal-to-the-metal," took just over 50 minutes. To this very day, I can say I've been in Rhode Island. Yet, having never set foot in that state, my experience is very limited. It is on my "bucket list" to one day see more of Rhode Island. Some workcampers slept through an entire state! Uah!

From the Pastor




I bring greetings to you, both from the three-session class we held at the Hartland Church as well as the Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting, held at the Green Lake Conference Center and attended by Sue Hrobar and Scott Burdette, representing respectively the Hartland and Genesee congregations.

While there were two different gatherings, each was linked together by a common theme of emphasis: welcoming immigrants in our midst. The Conference Annual Meeting adopted its only resolution by a near unanimous vote to explore the meaning and to enact policies with its congregations in the area of "Immigrant Welcoming." The class at Hartland was on the same topic after the Conference requested congregations to engage in this study. Church Council moved to hold these sessions on immigrant welcoming.

Personally speaking, the class and the Conference deliberations were a transformative and fresh new look at the faith. Of course, for years I have been well aware of the Biblical mandate to love and care for the sojourner and the stranger in our midst, "for you were once strangers in Egypt." (Deuteronomy 10:19, which is but one of scores of examples.). However, the current controversies in the public square have brought new light to this long-standing ethic of our Jewish and Christian faith heritage.

Another anniversary of our nation draws where we celebrate the principles upon which we distinguish ourselves. This reminds us, yet again, that how we welcome the alien and the non-citizen is critical to our national identity. Read the whole of Emma Lazarus' "The New Colossus," and consider how welcoming the immigrant is at the core of being true to the aspirations of both our national and faith founders. Lazarus makes reference to the Colossus of Rhodes, the world's largest statue in its time, which commemorated a successful defense in Greece against an attack from Cyprus some 2300 years ago. It is a symbol of force. This "New" Colossus representing our nation is not a soldier, but a woman with torch and tablet rejecting "storied pomp" and national might. Instead, the woman whispers, "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free..."

Our faith and national identities are more about welcoming than defending ourselves! Providing the "common defense" is also critical, and I don't pretend to know what is best to keep our country or the household of faith safe in these times. Such matters are far beyond my expertise and my knowledge, but one thing gives me pause today. The poet doesn't say anything about a wall. She speaks of a door and a concerted welcoming of the masses. I am compelled to join with the poet and the Biblical directive. Even if we must build walls, whether of stone and mortar or of policy and procedure in substance, we must make the effort to build as big a door as possible. It is our identity. It is what has made and will make us great.


