# Notes from Grandma's Attic

Traveling recently on Hwy. 16, on the way to Oconomowoc, I had a flashback to my childhood days. Until 1980, my uncle had a large, white house, on a hill, overlooking this highway. He was very fond of showing a framed photo of what the highway looked like – dated 1916. The road at that time was nothing more than an unpaved – often rutted – two-lane country road. Today it is a four-lane expressway. Wow! Things have really changed. Across the Oconomowoc River, and through a wooded area, was another large, white house: the one where my grandma lived.

By 1930, Highway 16 had been upgraded to a U.S. highway – and paved. In the late 1970's the winds of change were again coming to this area. The highway was upgraded to its present four-lane expressway status. Most of my uncle's property, including his house, barn and grandma's house and garage, were sold to the highway department. On the five remaining acres, my uncle had a new house built on Harbor Ct. My grandma's house was sold and literally moved to a new foundation, on Brown St., about a mile away. The house is still there today! Driving on Hwy. 16, through where my grandma's front yard had once been, I remember many lazy summer afternoons playing in that yard.

Another favorite place I remember was an unfinished, musty, upstairs room: "Grandma's Attic." The room had a large window that overlooked the dam on Upper Oconomowoc Lake. My grandma never learned to drive and had little use for TV. The small garage at the end of her driveway was empty, except for a large rowboat being stored by a neighbor. Her place of storage was this large attic room. In it were the organized memories of a lifetime; and the clutter of long unused items. The room – so I was told – was also the place where grandma would store the Christmas presents! Following grandma's death in 1973, my uncle, dad and I found many old things in the room, including a radio and some photo albums.

## From the Pastor



God: "Why is it so hard for you to believe? Is my physical existence any more improbable than your own? What about all that hoo-ha with the devil a while ago from that movie? Nobody had any problem believing that the devil took over and existed in a little girl. All she had to do was wet the rug, throw up some pea soup and everybody

believed. The devil you could believe, but not God?"

-From the film "Oh, God!" (1977), screenplay by Larry Gelbart

Perhaps you remember this film. I remember in Utah, where I was living at the time, it was quite controversial. The predominant religious group in the area sought to ban it and the afternoon paper wouldn't even print the title in the movie section. The listing read something on the order of "Show times for that new movie starring George Burns."

This quote from the interrogation of God in a courtroom speaks a seeming timeless truth about human attitude. Many of us claim to believe in God, but we appear to find it easier to believe in a devil.

This movie quote is Exhibit A of my case. Exhibit B is the fact that our observance of "All Saints' Day" is nearly unrecognizable in the shadow of how we celebrate Halloween. Granted, dressing up in costume and eating candy is far more appealing than singing the annual hymn, "For All the Saints," but these words from the God character in the movie should continue to challenge our thinking. Are we so jaded about the troubles of this world that it is easier to explain life with a devil in control instead of a loving God?

The way I understand it, the Roman Catholic Church established this holiday in 313 CE to make a general recognition of the many saints and martyrs that they had officially identified. The church started with individual recognition of saints, but, after just a couple of centuries, they realized that there are only 365 days in a year, which turned out to be a far from adequate number of days to recognize the number of saints.

So, the Catholic Church set November 1 as a catch all day for the recognition of the saints! That fact should inspire hope and trust in the presence of God on earth. Despite rather stringent qualification requirements the number grew too large, that of people whose lives were deemed to be the conveyors of the love of God on earth and continues to grow. Yet the night before All Saints', "All Hallows E'en," Halloween, appears to get much more attention. Feeding from our greater willingness to accept evil over good, our calendar recognizes All Saints', but it feels obliged to give the devil his due the night before! All that goodness can't stand alone. We must think there has to be an evening for darker beings that belongs to "them."

Dressing in costume is fun, I'll admit, and it is even fun to pretend to be an unsavory character for one night. It's just that we should be sure to recognize the predominating goodness of God. We Protestants don't generally name people as saints. We claim it is idolatrous or making certain people into gods. I get that, but in our zeal to purify our faith practice from such "heresies" we might fail to identify the real workings of God in the world. We fail to name people who have been instrumental in our upbringing in the Christian faith.

We will recognize All Saints' at our November 4 worship. I encourage you as well to take some time, whether on the 1<sup>st</sup>, on the 4<sup>th</sup>, or right now, to take an inventory of the good people who have been your saints. Say a prayer of thanks. Make this ritual surpass in importance any of your Halloween partying!

## Grandma's Attic - from Page 1

The person that I am today is very much a product of where I was and what I did growing up. Thinking back, I am reminded of that attic and I have many other cherished memories of where I once was; places remembered, but no longer there. I am also reminded of far less cherished memories and thoughts of how I could have done things differently. Yet, I have no regrets, for – hard lessons learned - those events have also made me the more cautious and discerning person I am today.

In the eye of my imagination, I can see myself being out in her neighbor's rowboat as grandma watches on from her attic. As to where I came from, I can only look back, wave at grandma, and float across the lake. I cannot go back. The current is too strong to turn around. All I have is a cherished memory of what once was. In the present moment all I can do is row the boat; and direct it toward the distant shore. As to the future, where I come ashore will be as much a product of my rowing skills – or lack thereof – and where the God-directed wind and waves will take me.

Our present lies on a moving and cutting edge between the past and the future. Like sitting – not standing – in a rowboat we all must have a balance between what was and what will be. Look back and remember the past. Remember the cherished memories of family and friends. Learn from your mistakes, knowing that God does forgive us from all unrighteousness. In the present, have an enjoyment of where you are. You may never be there again. But, **DON'T JUST SIT THERE!** Move those "oars" and put together a plan for your future. As you travel toward the future, know that God does, even now, have a plan for your life. Keep rowing and let God's winds and waves direct you toward the distant shoreline.

As a church, we have had a memorable journey of 175 years together. To move forward we must get out the "oars" and plan for our life together. I believe that, even now, God has a plan for our church. Get in the boat and start rowing! Grandma would be proud.




