Notes from a Navigator

"...we are more than conquerors through him who loved us."

Romans 8:37 (RSV)

I have always had a fascination for maps. As a child of seven, it was exciting for me to realize that the reality of the world about you can be miniaturized and turned into little black lines and blue splotches; and that the very things surrounding you also appear on a uniquely folded piece of paper. That's power! Through maps, the local world became not a thing to be feared, but a mysterious, fascinating, alive thing to be explored and conquered. Where does this road go? What's on the other side of that hill? How do I get there? It was through interpreting and creating maps, and using my bicycle to do the exploring, that I first discovered the intimate details of my own neighborhood, and ultimately those of southern Wisconsin.

Unlike a map, the real world is not static, but alive with change. A new subdivision is put there, that street is renamed, boundaries change. Ceylon becomes Sri Lanka, and on and on. Early on, I saw that need to keep revising my maps in order to maintain a thorough understanding of the world around me. Computer mapping programs now make this easier than ever.

Each of us carries maps. They are not the ones in some dusty glove compartment. They are the "maps" in our minds, maps of reality, of the way we "believe" things really are. Republicans are bad (or good), dogs are friendly, Chevys are dogs, Johnny can't read, I'm OK, snakes bite, bees will sting; and the list goes on and on. In the same way that the most accurate maps (topographic) are created from aerial photographs of the real world, it is only logical that we should replace our soon outdated "maps," the very genesis of prejudice, with new maps of reality. We must be constantly taking mental pictures of the world around us.

Since our September-October, 2019 edition a lot of things have happened in the life of your church.

- Rally Day was September 8. The 2019-2020 Sunday School year began.
- The 8th Annual Car Show was held on September 14. There were 82 cars. The event, as in previous years, was sponsored by S&S research – who paid for the band and the dash plaques. The total amount grossed, with donations, was \$3851.45. The raffle, alone, made over \$2300. \$751(20%) was donated to the Veterans and there was a \$100 expense for cleaning the Ed. Center after the event.
- A Rummage Sale was held on Thursday Saturday, October 3 – 5. A special THANK YOU to Hartland UCC for all their contributions. Rhea Whiteley reports that we are so grateful to everyone who gave their gift of time to help set up, run and clean-up our most successful rummage sale to date. It brought together a lot of volunteers who spent 20+ hours each organizing a record amount of donations and baking homemade goodies for the bake sale. It was hard work, but we all had great fun and we made over \$1700 from the rummage sale, which goes to our general operating fund – to meet our budget. In addition, we made \$168 from the bake sale – which goes toward the Sunday School program. Once again, THANK YOU!
- On October 16, we served the meal at Hope Center in Waukesha. Genesee Church is one of 46 congregations, throughout Waukesha County who serve a hot evening meal on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Out service dates for 2020 are Wednesday, March 25 and Friday, October 16.

From the Pastor

"For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?"

Luke 23:31



I want to talk about giving thanks. So, what am I doing, quoting this not-socheery verse? Perhaps I should have led with the refrain from a classic Thanksgiving-themed hymn: "All good gifts around us are sent from heaven of above. Then thank the Lord, O thank the Lord for all his love."¹

The occasion of the words from Jesus is the procession to his crucifixion. A group of people, largely women were wailing as Jesus was led to Golgotha outside the city. Jesus responded to their wailing by saying they should not weep for him but for themselves and for their children as the days to come will bring suffering and trial to their homes and families. The sad irony for Jesus is that, times are apparently good – the wood is "green." In tough times, the "dry" wood, he suggests, one would expect life will be even worse!

In case you have ever wondered about whether a pastor ever takes issue with verses in Scripture, I for one take issue with this one! It has been my experience that we are often at our worst when the wood is green! It is in the dry wood that often focuses our souls toward God. So, to challenge Jesus' point, I think it is normal for us to be neglectful of our appreciation for God and others when life pampers us. Instead of being grateful for bounty that was sent from heaven above, we often view bounty as our just reward for our efforts. It is only when bounty comes in the aftermath of lean times that we might see God's hand in it.

Yes, there are exceptions to my assertion, but when the memory of the "dry wood" fades, I submit to you – and to Jesus – that we tend to be at our worst in the Thanksgiving and Praise to God department. The troops I served were more present at Chapel as we saw the Gulf War deployment nearing. When the conflict subsided, so did attendance at worship. Even atheists may be heard saying, "O My God!" when a calamity arises. Is OMG just an expression? Perhaps there are times when it becomes real any of us.

We can hang on to thankfulness that is deliverance from trouble, for a time, but we must be wary of the diminishing of thankfulness. In Exodus the saga of Israel being enslaved begins with the statement in the first chapter: "Now there arose a new king over Egypt, who did not know Joseph." Again, yes, the Israelites turned from God in the dire times of the wilderness. That is an exception, but the great prophets challenged the Chosen

People after they had gained possession of the Promised Land with words such as the prophet Amos, when he announced, "Woe to those who are at ease in Zion." (Amos 6:1)

Here is my point. A thankful heart must be nurtured at all times, in dry wood and green wood alike. Such a heart is critical to the quality of our faith. Thankfulness proclaims the necessary truth of our connectedness with our Creator and our fellow creatures. Without thankfulness we try to put ourselves in the center of the world. A little "dry wood" times often puts all things in correct perspective. In all times, green or dry, let us "Thank the Lord, O thank the Lord for all God's love!"

I am continually amazed at people who can have a map in front of them and still not match its various lines and squiggles to the world around them. To not make that connection is to become "lost." How often do they panic, or look in vain for familiar landmarks. They become complacent with what they know and never have the joy of exploring the unknown.

When our mental "maps" of reality become outdated, blurred and just plain wrong, we wander in vain grabbing at any "landmarks" we can find. Drug abuse, smoking and alcoholism are the "vehicles" we often use to make the search. We often discover dead ends not on our maps.

To really connect, to stay informed and match our understanding of the world around us to what is really happening, is to no longer fear becoming lost. It is to continue discovering the new, unexplored horizons before us; to become inquisitive – as children – about the small details around us and the greater heavens above us. It is to not be conquered by the world, but – in our own unique way – to conquer, to even dare to change reality. It is, inquisitively, to "map" a small piece of the world around us and explore life to its fullest.

Ultimately, it is to boldly face the trials and temptations that may come if we select a different road to travel. We may "boldly go forth where no man (or woman) has gone before," knowing that it is through the son of the very "author if life" that we are able to "become more than conquerors through him who loved [and still loves] us." (Romans 8:37) To earnestly "map" the world around us, with all its mystery and fascination, is to truly be addicted to life.
