#### From the Pastor



Paging through the columns of times past, I noted these lines from one I wrote on January 1, 2020.

I feel moved at the first of this year to encourage us all to pay heed to epiphanies! We, who can be consumed by many great and overpow-

ering things, need epiphanies... we need them now more than ever.

A year ago, I - we - may have been aware of the coronavirus that had barely made the news, but I am certain that we had no comprehension of it becoming a pandemic that continues to grip us to this day. I am sad to report that these words from last year ring true as we make our way, stumbling often, through this crisis. The annual reports of both congregations are in and the picture that they paint is increasingly bleak. At first, we rose to the occasion. Contributions at the beginning of the year were ahead of the pace of previous years. I will infer that some of this can be attributed to "shelter at home" behaviors. I suspect that you, like me, haven't put as many miles on the car as in previous years. You likely have curtailed the number of times that you have ventured out, and you haven't been frequenting your favorite restaurants or places of recreation. Consequently, the savings account has grown for most of us. Those who have lost jobs or income during the pandemic, I hold you in prayer certainly. I also gather that most of our membership have not seen a significant drop in resources. With all of that extra money at our disposal, many had fulfilled their pledged obligations to the church earlier than in non-pandemic times.

That is beginning to change now, and, while we maintain a robust attendance in our Zoom worship, there are clearly those who do not attend. The reasons for non-attendance vary. Some don't have the means. Some don't feel they have the knowhow and could "never" acquire it. Some just don't think worship online is, well, worshipful. What has happened as a result is that both congregations have lost the offering of those who don't pledge, but rather "pay as you go." We are indeed feeling this hit to the budget significantly now. the plea to folk on Sunday, but frankly the ones who love our churches, those who are not with us on Sundays, need to be reached.

Please understand. We cannot meet until it is safe. When it is safe enough - for there has always been a risk for any number of communicable infections - the doors will open. The doors will open, IF we keep paying the bills that don't care whether we meet or not! Such dedication to our church families is a significant expression of true stewardship. Offering is not supposed to be an investment for services as if you were a customer. It is not the "price of admission," nor is it a quid pro quo because you received Sunday worship or some other service rendered. Offering to God is an expression of devotion with no expectation of personal return. It is a commitment to ensure that God's work is done in the world in all times. In this age, giving to the church is an expression of hope and a test of one's mettle as to the true reason for giving.

I implore you all to contribute to your church and its ongoing ministries. Yes, that includes the light bill, but we are still reaching out to minister to those in need, and the need has grown for many in this world. We still hold worship each week, and Bible study, and I hope more of you muster the means by which to find a way to make this worship worshipful. The day will come when the doors will be open. The ruling committees of each congregation are working on infection and vaccination rates as determination factors. They are heeding guidance from the State, the Wisconsin Conference and the Wisconsin Council of Churches to articulate the milestone that we must reach to be safe. Sadly, the circumstance is nowhere near the safety level we need, but there is hope. The news at this writing declared that vaccines are rolling out ahead of schedule, and we should see a marked change in the number of people vaccinated.

The message then, is to keep looking for "epiphanies" to encourage you in this difficult time. They won't be the ones we have usually relied upon, but look for them. They are there! Hope and trust in God. We will get through this. 'Twas grace that brought us safe thus far, and grace will lead us back to the sanctuary!

She hopes the added income will fund her son's education to become a professional. At the same time, she is teaching them, the land is part of their future – they are responsible for protecting the spring on their property. With support from CEPAD and One Great Hour of Sharing, Luisa is planting seeds that will bear abundant fruit for today, tomorrow, and years to come. With God's help and contribu-

tions from people like you – these seeds will bear far more than we can imagine.
