#### **Pastoral Ponderings**

Dear Friends and members of Genesee church,

**M**y time with you is quickly drawing to a close. Your pastoral search committee has worked diligently in their assigned task to discern which individual will be offered a pastoral call to serve as your next settled pastor. The pastoral search committee is hoping that after a vote of affirmation that this new individual will begin to serve on Sunday March 12.

Once a call to a new pastor is confirmed, there are a few things you can do to prepare to follow your new spiritual leader:

- Pray for your new pastor. In most of the churches I know, members pray for the Pastor Search Team throughout the search process, and they pray for the pastor even before they know the identity of their new minister. And they pray for their new pastor in the pastor's first days of ministry. However, I suggest making a commitment to pray daily for your pastor throughout the duration of his or her ministry. Once the honeymoon period is over, and the daily grind of ministry begins, praying for your pastor will strengthen your pastor's ministry and will fortify your bond with your pastor.
- Send your pastor a welcome note or email. Be careful not to make this correspondence a lengthy epistle and certainly don't make it a diatribe itemizing your personal expectations or agenda. Just offer a brief note, introducing yourself and/or family, and offering a heartfelt welcome.
- Mention your name on your first several encounters with your new pastor. Once your new pastor arrives, make sure to offer your name in each greeting for the first few weeks. Learning names is important for pastors. And be sure not to embarrass the pastor by quizzing, "Do you remember my name?" Give your pastor the opportunity to learn your name, and over time, to learn a part of your life story.

**S**ince Pastor Dave joined us as our interim minister, some two years ago, the Search and Call committee of Genesee and Hartland UCC have reviewed over 50 pastor profiles and interviewed many candidates. A well-attended "meet and greet" occurred on Saturday, January 21 (Noon – 2 PM at Genesee). On Sunday, January 22, the Rev. James Langreder led us in worship. After service a congregational vote was taken on the candidate. The result – a unanimous 28 – 0!

Rev. James Langreder will start, with us, on Sunday, March 12. We are all very excited to have Pastor Jim join us.

The final service with Pastor Dave will be February 26. He was called as our Interim pastor and we will all miss him, but he did his job of helping our churches transition to a new minister. We thank him for all his work in preparing us to move on. In conjunction with our sister church in Hartland, we will hold a celebration for him on his last Sunday. Please watch for further details.

# Introducing Rev. James A. Langreder

Jim grew up in our community attending Kettle Moraine Highschool. He has attended churches in our community since

he was a child. He has served a number of different churches in our community since his youth, doing everything from leading music programs and teaching Sunday School to being a Youth Minister and Choir Director.

He was a music buyer and store manager at The Giving Tree Christian Book Store from 1993 until 2003. He loves music and books! He has owned his own business since 2003. Jim's pastoral training includes a variety of courses in Faith Formation, Pastoral Care, Polity and Boundary training through the Damascus Project of the Wisconsin and Minnesota conferences of the United Church of Christ. He has been a part of the Damascus Project from 2019 until today. Jim also served a Chaplaincy at Advocate Sherman Hospital in Elgin, IL from 2021 to 2022. Since January of 2022 Jim has served the First Congregational Church of East Troy, UCC. He has been serving the UCC church in East Troy as a Member in Discernment with the SE Association of the UCC and as a Licensed Minister of the Wisconsin Conference of the UCC. He also serves as the Vice-Moderator of the SE Association of the UCC.

In Jim's profile, he describes his skills for ministry in the following way:

Excellent liturgy planning. Compassionate. Thoughtful. Considerate. Reliable. Hard-Working. Responsible. Trustworthy. Lead by example through my gentle character. People have always been comfortable talking with me. I am open, honest and caring.

Today Jim lives in Delafield with his husband Alex who is the Owner of the ElleBelle Salon in Wales. Jim and Alex have three adopted children all of whom attend school in the KM School district.

- Embrace the uniqueness of your pastor. Your pastor has a distinct personality, a unique set of spiritual gifts, and a diverse set of experiences. When the Spirit leads a church to a new pastor, the Spirit seldom leads a church or committee to a person just like the previous pastor or the beloved pastor from the church's history. To compare your new pastor to any other is to disrespect the Spirit's role in guiding you to your new pastor in the first place.
- Be prepared to follow. A pastor who is worth his or her salt must lead in both optimal and challenging situations. And the kingdom of God is enriched when we as a congregation follow our pastor and embrace our mission with enthusiasm. The vast majority of pastors I know provide proactive leadership that is Spirit-led and mission focused. Don't be a backseat driver. Serve with your best gifts.
- Give your pastor permission to fail. The best pastors don't succeed 100% of the time. Don't hold your pastor to a standard of perfection that is impossible to maintain. Allow your minister room to make mistakes.
- Speak positively about your pastor publicly and privately. One of the ways we bring out the best in our ministers is to speak well of them publicly and privately. With most pastors, it is easy to find something to criticize, because every minister has weaknesses. However, every pastor has more strengths than weaknesses. A healthy pastoral tenure is nurtured when we magnify around our pastor's strengths, and then minimize and compensate for our pastor's weaknesses.

A few last thoughts...

First thank you for the many ways in which you have helped me serve as your interim pastor. These days are bittersweet. I am filled with joy that you have found a candidate to serve as your new pastor. He or she is fortunate. However, I have truly enjoyed my time with you, and I will miss seeing all of you.

I appreciated your friendship and support especially the time of my challenges with my health. I am confident that each of your prayers made a real difference toward my recovery. I appreciated your patience in allowing me to heal before jumping back into the saddle at work.

My last Sunday with you will be February 26. You will have a quest speaker on March 5 and then your new pastor will begin to serve on March 12. Due to professional boundaries I and my family will need to step away for the benefit of the congregation and myself. At this point in time, I am not certain where I will begin to serve, but I re

main confident that God will have a place for me to continue.

I wish for you grace, love, and strength as you continue to serve your neighbors and communities.

#### **Ground Hog Day "facts"**

**Groundhog Day** originates from an ancient celebration of the midway point between the winter solstice and the spring equinox—the **day** right in the middle of astronomical winter. According to superstition, sunny skies that **day** signify a stormy and cold second half of winter while cloudy skies indicate the arrival of warm weather.

It is a holiday on **February 2**. It is usually celebrated in North America. It marks about six weeks before the end of winter. It began in the year **1886**. This holiday celebrates "Punxsutawney Phil", a groundhog who can supposedly forecast the weather.

Groundhogs are famous for predicting Spring. According to legend, if the groundhog comes out of his burrow on February 2 and does not see his shadow then, Spring will come early. If the groundhog sees a shadow, than it goes back into its burrow and Winter will last six more weeks.
