

Notes from the Middle

In October 2012, I journeyed to Lebanon, Kansas.

Today, I am standing in the middle of America. Located in a park near the junction of AA Road and 130 Road, the geographical marker – pictured above – marks the exact center of the contiguous 48 United States. If you were to make a cardboard cutout of the (lower 48) United States and balance it on a pin, the pin would puncture the cardboard right here.

On a cool October afternoon, I sat down at a picnic table in the park. I sense the awesome isolation of this place. The nearest town, Lebanon, Kansas, is two mile to the southeast. Its water tower and grain silos beckon. A solitary farmstead sits in the valley across from the park. In every other direction, harvested fields reach to the horizon. The tourists, if there were any, have left for the season. In some ways this place is like many others in America's heartland; and yet, by location alone, it is very special. At this very moment, I, alone, am the most central person in America! Lest I be overcome with visions of great power and grandeur, I humble myself with the realization that this temporary "power" is one of location only.

The fact is that all of us are born off-center; not just in physical location, but in our relationship with God. A long time ago, when God had finished creating the world, He made a special place at the center of His creation. Adam and Eve knew it as "Eden." They lived a good, well-centered life. God "walked" with them in the garden and knew them personally (Genesis 3:8). Long story short, Adam and Eve sinned against God by not following His directions. Then were banned from the Garden of Eden. Since then, Adam's descendants – including us – have been living life off-center. All "religions"* developed since those days have made attempts to get us back on-center and reconcile us to the will of God. All have been the vain attempts of us humans, and all have ultimately failed.

[*I define "religion" as those attempts by humanity to try to reach out to God: to reconcile ourselves to God. In Christianity ALONE, God reaches down to us, completing the "circuit." In that sense, and perhaps that sense alone, "Christianity" is NOT a religion.]

Is there a way to again be reconciled to the will of God, a way to get back on-center with the life God intends for us to live? YES! Like Dorothy, in the "Wizard of Oz," do we need to go back to Kansas to return to the center of God's will? NO! Before we chalk off our failure to be reconciled to God as just another part of our lowly human condition, and write ourselves off as unworthy of knowing our creator, know this... Even while we were failing in our attempt to reach God, He has already reached down to us. God, and God alone, has given us a "way" to get back on-center with Him! (see Romans 5: 8)

That "way" is the true message of the Christmas Story. The story begins some 2,000 years ago in a small backwater town of the mighty Roman Empire: Bethlehem. God provided a way for us to be reconciled to Him and get back on-center with His will. He also gave us a way to get back the eternal life that Adam lost at the "closed gates" to Eden. He sent His only son, Jesus, to us; not as a king or mighty warrior, but as one born in a lowly manger. The story, as we know it, is very serene. Angels make a special visit, Mary and Joseph adore their newborn son, shepherds come to worship Him and wise men bring gifts. Then we leave the Christmas Program and go home. We leave the baby Jesus in the manger! Wait people! There is more to the story!

Jesus grew up and lived among us, sharing our human condition. He taught God's message in the synagogues and on the hillsides; he cared for people and healed their conditions. He showed us how to get back on-center with our God and showed us the way to eternal life with Him, in His "kingdom." Then one day, His mission on earth was fulfilled. Fearing competition to the Emperor's worldly authority, those authorities prosecuted God's son and nailed Him, as a common criminal, to a cross. By "Good" Friday afternoon, Jesus was dead. That evening, He was lying in a tomb. The Roman officials gave a sigh of relief: STORY OVER!

WRONG! If all we had were the Christmas Story and a well-lived life, then Jesus is no more then just another great profit. Mohammed is dead! Buddha is dead! ..."Why do you seek the living among the dead?" "...He is not here..." "...He has risen,..." (Luke 24:5; Mark 16:6) That first Easter Sunday morning, the resurrected Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene and, later, the disciples.

We still live with our human conditions. We continue to disobey God's will. But now, because of the resurrection, we can be reconciled, again, to God; we can get back on-center with His will; and one day we can have eternal life in paradise. "For God so loved the world, that WHOEVER believes in Him will not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16)




