Notes from a Library

"All scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness."

2 Timothy 3:16 (RSV)

What a wonderous place a library is! Within its walls are shelf after shelf, of books on just about any subject imaginable: the collected knowledge of humanity. Today, I am at the Waukesha Public Library looking for books written by one of my favorite science writers, the late Isaac Asimov. In this age of the internet, much of the knowledge within these walls – and more – is accessible with a laptop computer and a few clicks of the mouse. That being said, I still get a sense of satisfaction from reading text and viewing illustrations on the pages of a good old printed and bound volume. Through the magic of the printed page, once living people from all cultures are able to reach out to us and tell their stories: accounts about the world they lived in and what they learned!

One special collection of these accounts has come down to us from our ancestors. It is a book that has many "books" within it, originally written down on scrolls over a 1,600 year period: a mini-library under one set of end covers. It is a book that many of us have a dusty version of somewhere on our shelves at home: The Bible.

The Bible is divided into two "testaments:" the "Old Testament" and the "New Testament." The word "testament" means "covenant," or "agreement." The Old Testament is the covenant God made with humanity about his salvation before Christ came. The New Testament is the agreement God made with humanity about his salvation after Christ came. In the Old Testament we find a covenant of law: in the New Testament a covenant of grace - which came through Jesus Christ. Written down by some 40 authors, the 66 books of the Bible (Protestant versions) are the inspired word of God. (see: 2 Timothy 3:16). Compared to many modern novels, most books of the Bible are not very long. The shortest book, 3rd John, is much shorter than this article. The longest book, Psalms, could be read, in its entirety, during the length of a lazy summer afternoon.

It was on one such afternoon, over 30 years ago, that I stood in El Paso, Texas and looked across the Rio Grande River toward Juárez, México. On a hill above Juárez, someone has painted – in large white letters – the following message: "La Biblia es la verdad. Leela." ["The Bible is the truth. Read it!"]


